SPECIFICATIONS FOR PIZZA VENDOR CONTRACT – 2022-2023

LaSalle-Peru Township High School District No. 120

INSTRUCTION TO BIDDERS

The Board of Education of LaSalle-Peru Township High School District No. 120 (hereinafter sometimes referred to as the "District") will receive bids for pizza vendor services in accordance with these Instructions to Bidders and the Specifications set forth below. Bids will be publicly opened and read aloud on May 12, 2022, at 11:00 a.m. at the District Office at 541 Chartres Street, LaSalle, Illinois.

All bids must be submitted in duplicate.

All bids must be accompanied by a Bid Security in the form of a Bid Bond, Certified Check or Cashier's Check (payable to the Board of Education of School District 120) in the amount of five per cent (5%) of the total amount of the bid. By submitting a bid, it is agreed that the Bid Security will be forfeited if the Bidder fails to execute the Pizza Vendor Contract in conformity with the Specifications within seven (7) days after notification of the award of the Pizza Vendor Contract to such Bidder.

Each bidder expressly agrees that such bid may not be withdrawn for a period of sixty (60) days from the opening thereof. Withdrawal thereof within such period shall subject the bidder to forfeiture of Bid Security, as well as penalties and damages to the District to the extent that such withdrawal results in loss to the District.

SPECIFICATIONS

1. The Vendor shall maintain an adequate number of suitable vehicles, together with licensed drivers, for the delivery of Vendor's product to the District for the school year 2022-2023.

2. The Vendor shall pay for all the expenses of the Vendor's operation, including the salary, taxes, insurance and other compensation for all its personnel.

3. The bids shall be submitted with the necessary documentation to meet "Minimum Insurance Requirements", as outlined in the attached.

The Vendor shall name the Board of Education and District as additional insured. Copies and Certificate of Insurance policy shall be furnished to the District by the Vendor.

4. The Vendor shall keep all of its equipment and product in such condition as to meet all of the requirements of the State of Illinois, Illinois Office of Education, the Illinois Secretary of State, all other Illinois state agencies and/or of any agency of the United States of America which prescribes regulations or standards for such equipment and product, and said equipment and product shall at all times be kept in such condition that they meet with the approval of, and be subject to, the inspection by any officer or agent of any of the above-described governmental agencies.

5. Vendor shall provide a completed “Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility, and Voluntary Exclusion as required by the Illinois State Board of Education (Form ISBE 85-34 included).

6. Vendor shall deliver pizza product not less than three (3) times on those days when product is requested by the school. Deliveries shall include 11:15 a.m., 11:50 a.m., and 12:20 p.m. (Monday & Thursday) and 10:35 am, 11:05 am, and 11:35 am on the following Wednesdays - 8/17, 8/24, 8/31, 9/7, 9/14, 9/21, 9/28, 10/5, 10/12, 10/19, 11/2, 11/9, 11/16, 11/30, 12/7, 12/14, 1/11, 1/18, 1/25, 2/1, 2/8, 2/15, 2/22, 3/1, 3/8, 3/15, 3/22, 3/29, 4/12, 4/19, 4/26, 5/3 and 5/10 unless otherwise notified by the District. Please note that the 2022-2023 school calendar is included with this packet. Pizza will be available each Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday that students are in attendance and lunch is served. The District may require additional deliveries, i.e., Fridays during lent.

7. Bidders must specify in their proposals that, should the Contract be awarded to them, they will enter into a Pizza Vendor Contract substantially in the form of the *draft* Pizza Vendor Contract attached to these Bid Specifications and incorporated herein by reference thereto. Each bidder is charged with the duty to review, and shall be conclusively presumed to have thoroughly reviewed, the *draft* Pizza Vendor Contract with such bidder's legal counsel and with the duty of becoming fully acquainted with the terms and conditions thereof, including all of bidder's responsibilities and duties there under.

8. All bidders must state their proposed rates and charges for pizza product in dollar amounts which are definitely ascertainable at the time of opening the bids. All bids must conform to the State of Illinois Competition Food Standards. Bids must specify the type and variety of products offered and prices associated therewith, i.e.

Competitive Food Standards Guidelines:

Grain Items: Acceptable grain items must include 50% or more whole grains by weight, or have whole grains as the first ingredient.

Total Fats: Acceptable food items must have less than or equal to 35% from total fat as served.

Saturated Fats: Acceptable food items must have less than 10% calories from saturated fat as served.

Trans Fats: Zero grams of trans fat as served (less than or equal to .5 g per portion).

Sugar: Acceptable food items must have less than or equal to 35% of weight from total sugar as served.

Sodium: Snack items and side dishes sold a la carte: less than or equal to 230 mg sodium per item as served.
Entrée items sold a la carte: less than or equal to 480 mg sodium per item as served, including any accompaniments.

Calories: Snack items and side dishes sold a la carte: less than or equal to 200 calories per item as served, including any accompaniments.
Entrée items sold a la carte: less than or equal to 350 calories per item as served including any added accompaniments.

Product to be delivered hot, individually packaged in boxes, with “table spacers” included. If a bid is based on a formula, the bid must also set forth the maximum rate or charge in a specific dollar amount.

9. The school administration will work with the successful bidder in supplying needed information regarding the pizza product requirements of students.

Bids are due no later May 12, 2022, at 11:00 a.m. and are to be submitted in a sealed envelope bearing the bidder's name, address, and marked "BID SPECIFICATIONS FOR PIZZA VENDOR SERVICES FOR DISTRICT NO. 120." No bids will be accepted after this date and time. Bidder assumes the risk of any delay in the handling or delivery of mail. All bids are to be submitted to the following address:

PIZZA VENDOR CONTRACT

THIS CONTRACT is made and entered into this _____ day of _____ 2021, by and between the Board of Education of LaSalle-Peru Township High School District 120, hereinafter referred to as "District," and _____ hereinafter referred to as "Vendor".

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, the District has given proper notice by publication in accordance with Illinois Law, and the Vendor, pursuant to said notice has submitted a bid, the terms of which reflect said Vendor to be the lowest responsible bidder in an amount satisfactory to the District.

WHEREAS, it is understood and agreed between the parties that Vendor is an independent contractor in the performance of each and every part of this Contract, that the Vendor is solely and personally liable for all damages which may be occasioned on account of the operation of this Contract, whether the same be for personal injury to its employees, agents or others, whether in a vehicle or not, or damages of any other kind; and

WHEREAS, the parties intend that Vendor be an independent contractor and not an agent or employee of District. The District is only interested in the results obtained by this Contract. None of the benefits provided by the District to employees, including, but not limited to, income tax, compensation insurance and unemployment insurance, are available from District to employees of Vendor.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter contained, it is agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:

1. INCORPORATED. The recitals set forth above are incorporated herein and made a part hereof.
2. SERVICES. The District hereby contracts Vendor to deliver pizza product to the High School for an original term of one (1) year, covering the school year beginning July 1, 2022 and ending June 30, 2023.

If the parties agree on an extension it shall be reduced to writing and signed by both parties.

3. CONSIDERATION. The District shall pay the Vendor pursuant to Exhibit "A", which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, the appropriate charge for the amount of product delivered to the school. No charges shall be made for days on which the District has notified the Vendor that service will not be necessary, including but not limited to, acts of God, emergencies, and work stoppages.

4. DELIVERIES. Vendor shall deliver pizza product not less than three (3) times per requested school day. Deliveries shall include 11:15 a.m., 11:50 a.m., and 12:20 p.m. (Monday & Thursday) and 10:35 am, 11:05 am, and 11:35 am on Wednesdays highlighted in green on the District Calendar 2022-2023, unless otherwise notified by the District. Vendor shall make its best efforts to make such additional deliveries as may be requested by the District.

5. VENDOR'S PRODUCT. The amount and type of Vendor's product to be delivered shall be established by the Cafeteria Director of the School District and communicated to the Vendor. The Cafeteria Director may at any time, add, eliminate, alter, reduce, and/or extend such requests for product herein covered.

6. **ASSERTIONS.** In order to provide such product in an efficient and safe manner, said Vendor hereby agrees:

- a. To operate the necessary number of vehicles to provide for such needs as may be agreed by the parties from time to time.
- b. To provide pizza product, which is in good marketable condition, warm and ready to eat, free to contamination or other defect, and suitable for the needs of the District at all times.
- c. To provide the necessary licenses and inspections for the Vendor's product and equipment as required by any governmental agency which shall from time to time prescribe regulations for the Vendor's product and equipment.
- d. To provide competent, efficient, trained, and courteous delivery personnel, who shall at all times possess a valid license for driving Vendor's vehicle(s).
- e. To carry and to keep in full force and effect at all times insurance to meet "Minimum Insurance Requirements", as outlined in the attached.
- f. The Vendor shall name the Board of Education and District as additional insured. Copies and Certificate of Insurance policy shall be furnished to the District by the Vendor.

7. **APPLICABLE LAWS.** This Contract is not intended as setting forth all the duties and obligations of Vendor, but rather is specifically made subject to the Illinois School Code, the rules and regulations of the Illinois State Board of Education, the rules and regulations of the Board of Education of this District and its Superintendent, and all other applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules and regulations Vendor agrees to abide thereto.

Vendor shall provide a completed "Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility, and Voluntary Exclusion as required by the Illinois State Board of Education" (Form ISBE 85-34).

8. **NECESSARY REPORTS.** Vendor and its employees shall make such reports as may be required by the Illinois State Board of Education, the Regional Superintendent of Schools, the School District, or other applicable agency or authority and to notify the District of any changes affecting the issues of necessary permits and licenses.

9. **CONTRACT MANAGER.** Vendor shall designate the Contract Manager (if different from the owner) who shall be responsible for Vendor's performance of this Contract and shall be the Vendor's contact person for the District.

10. **INDEMNIFICATION.** Vendor understands and acknowledges that Vendor agrees to assume all risk of injury or damage to any person or property and agrees to indemnify and hold harmless School Board, District, its employees, and servants against any injury or damage to any person or property, including reasonable attorney fees as a result of actions or omissions by the Vendor, its employees or agents.

11. **PAYMENT.** District shall make monthly payments to Vendor for services and product rendered hereunder, subject to approval by the District's Board of Education, immediately following the regular monthly Board meeting which generally falls on the third Wednesday of the month, except that no payment shall be due for any month when no pizza product services are furnished hereunder, and further, that no payment shall exceed the amount owed for the actual number of days of services provided to the District up to the date of payment.

12. SERVICE BREACH. If any Vendor delivery is five (5) minutes later than the scheduled arrival time at school, the Vendor shall be in breach of this provision. The Superintendent or Board of Education may, in its sole discretion, excuse said breach in the event of travel advisories within the school district, accidents caused by other drivers or other similar extenuating circumstances. If Vendor has committed three (3) such breaches within any school semester, the District may consider Vendor in default and terminate this Contract immediately and without notice.

13. GENERAL BREACH. Failure of the Vendor to comply with any terms of this Contract shall be deemed a breach of this Contract. In that event the District shall be entitled to terminate the Contract as it deems appropriate.

14. ASSIGNMENT. The Vendor is to ensure satisfactory performance of all the said work and provision of all said product set out in this agreement and shall not sell or assign its contract to any other person or entity except with the approval of the District.

15. SEVERABILITY. The clauses, sentences and parts of this Contract are severable to the extent found to be unlawful or ineffective, by a court of competent jurisdiction, but if so held, the remaining provisions hereof shall remain in full force and effect.

16. AMBIGUITIES: Any ambiguities in this Contract will not be strictly construed against the drafter of the language but shall be resolved by applying the most reasonable interpretation under the circumstances, giving full consideration to the intentions of the parties at the time of signing this Contract.

17. CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION. In case anything arises not covered by this Agreement, the matter shall be resolved as determined appropriate by the District in its sole discretion.
